

National Classification Process- new applicants <u>Visual impairments</u>

- Visually impaired athletes must obtain an eligible classification grade from British Blind Sport (BBS) and have a confirmed medical diagnosis which is the cause of the visual impairment.
- Contact BBS via there <u>website</u> to go through their application process.
- Once you have received your BBS certificate, check if you have been allocated a classification grade which is eligible for conversion into a para equestrian grade.
- If your BBS grade is eligible for conversion, send your BBS classification certificate and medical evidence of the confirmed diagnosis which has caused the vision impairment to the <u>Felicity Towers</u> (British Equestrian Classification Coordinator).
- Your BBS grade will then be converted into a para equestrian grade.

Partially sighted (B3) athletes who have limited vision in both eyes either in: How far they can see (visual acuity) How wide they can see (visual field)
